Sir,-

Referring to letter addressed you on the 4th instant, in regard to lease for the use of the school of 50 or 75 acres on Reserve 16 A, I have to inclose form of surrender, in duplicate, which you are hereby authorized to submit to the Indians under and in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Act. I would call attention to the fact that the master of acres to be surrendered is left blank in the description, and you will be good enough to fill in the number of acres between 50 and 75 which may be agreed upon.

I am inclosing for your information copy of instructions to agents in regard to taking surrender, and you will be good enough to follow closely the requirements of the Department, furnishing a voters: list and advising as to the number of Indians present at the meeting the number voting for the surrender and the number voting against.
