Sir,-

I beg to say that recently Mrs I. Ismacs, of Restigouche, forwarded to the Department your report of the 24th June in regard to her daughter Miss Margaret Isaacs, who is tubercular. As you recommended treatment for the girl in a sanitarium the Department wrote the Superintendent of the Laurentian Sanitarium at Ste Agathe des Monts, requesting that she be admitted to that institution. A reply has been received to the effect that the Sanitarium is at present filled to capacity, but that posaibly later on she ray be received as a patient. The Superintendent has stated that your report gave the impression that Miss Isaac's suffers from tuberculosis in an advanced stage, and that possibly the case is incurable, and not suitable for sanitarium treatment. He wishes, however, to be furnished with further particulars on the form herewith enclosed, which I have to request that you will fill out and return to the Department.
