Sir  
 I am C-4451 Pte Marcel Lariviere of  
 the Royal 22<sup>e</sup> Regiment during a term of three  
 years' hard labour.

My request to you, Sir, if you could  
 take few minutes of your time to read this  
 letter, I am sorry to be such a nuisance  
 to you, Sir, you are the only one that can  
 do something for me.

I was given sentence in England  
 by a Field General Court-Marshal to three  
 years' hard labour, of this sentence I served  
 twenty-four months on the twenty-eight  
 of January 1945. I lost by my misconduct  
 7 days which make my date of release  
 the 6 February 1945. Well Sir, on my return  
 to Canada I was told by the Major of  
 No 62 M.D.B. at Bowden Camp that my  
 date was on the 6 February 1945, I was  
 transfer here to finish my term, but  
 for some reasons which I ask your  
 if you could tell me if it possible  
 why when I came here I was told my  
 date was the 9 April 1945, Sir it make  
 two more months to do which I should  
 not do.

Please Sir tell me why I should  
 serve 2 more months of this sentence, Am  
 sure if there is one who can help me in  
 this matter, it is you. Please Sir, I beg  
 of you to help me, I know I should not  
 spend this being a criminal made it  
 very hard for me to ask this of you,  
 Sir I beg of you to help me  
 to be release from these places. I do be wrong  
 Sir, but I serve my sentence, but I do  
 not want to do more.

I hope Sir you take my case  
 your utmost consideration. My date should  
 be the 6 February 1945. Thank you,
