No 282. Dairy secret for increasing the quantity of Cream.

No 283. Tincture for the Teeth and Gums.

Mix six ounces of the Peruvian bark with half an ounce of sal ammoniac. Shake them well a few minutes every time before the tincture is used. The method of using it is, to take a tea spoonful and hold it near the teeth; then with a finger dipped in it rub the teeth and game, which are afterwards to be washed with warm wa-This tincture not only allays the toothache, but preserves both the teeth and gums, and makes them adhere to each other.
