April.—Gurrant bushes should be set in rows four to five feet apart, and four feet apart in the row. Set plants one year old of very strong, or two years from the cutting. The land should be very well manured; for currants seem to flourish in a very rich soil. The gooseberry may be set and treated in the same way. Blackberries like a rich, moist soil; should be set in rows, from seven to eight feet apart; and the plants four feet apart in the row. They should be set in the spring, and trained or tied up to wire trellises. Grape vines may be set in the field or garden, eight feet apart each way, and trained to wires fastened to posts running through the field. It is enough to plough the land for all the above named fruits. Manure well, except for grape vines, they are better with only little manuring.
