Peterborough, the county seat, and nearest
banking point, and 30 north of Lakefield,
the nearest railroad point. Settled in 1870.
It contains a public school, and ships logs
and lumber. Mail by stage from Apsley
once a week. Alexander Graham, post-
master.

CLAPPISON. A small place in Flam-
borough East township, Wentworth County,
5 miles north of Hamilton, the county seat,
and nearest bank location and railway point.
Not a post office.

CLAREMONT. A village on Duffin's
creek (which furnishes power) and on the O
div C P Ry, in Pickering township, Ontario
County, 16 miles north-west of Whitby, the
county seat, and 9 north of Pickering, the
nearest banking point. Settled in 1825. It
contains Presbyterian, Methodist and Bap-
tist churches and public school, and ships
live stock, lumber, grain and flour. Stage
to Stouffville daily, fare 40c. Population,
500. Telegraph, GNW. Express, Dominion.
Mail daily. J M McNab, postmaster.

and 3 south of Thurso (PQ), on the C P Ry,
its nearest railroad point. Nearest bank at
Ottawa, 25 miles west, to which steamboats
run daily during summer. Settled in 1783.
It contains a Baptist church and public
school, and ships hay, lumber, grain and
cordwood. Stage daily to Thurso, fare 25c.
Population, 200. Mail daily. Thomas Wil-
son, postmaster.
