HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any oven numbered section of Dominion Lands in Mantes Borth-West Twritheries, excepting 8 and 28, which has not it stended, or reserved to projetic wood lots for settlem, or purposes, may be homesteaded apon by say person who is the of a finally, or any male over 18 years of age, to the arts quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY

Butty must be made personally at the local land of friet in which the land is situate. HOMESTRAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homostead in required by the provisions of the Deminion Lands Act and the amondments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father for mottier, if the father is deceased of the home-steader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be entiated by such person re-siding with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a secon homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain g patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (6) or (4) must cultivate 80 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Byery homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Impactor. Before making application fer patent, the settler may give six months' sotice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention te do so.

INFORMATION. Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba ser the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and ansistance in securing land to sput them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Beit in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoha, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitoba or the North-West Territories.
