New York, May 27 .- W. V. Logan, of the Goodyear from Russia, says:

"When war started there were only 12,500 motor vehicles in Russia. The Government purchased between \$15,000,000 and \$20,000,000 worth of new machines while I was there. After the war American automobile products will be well known. The introduction is now being made."

Taking up general conditions in Russia, Mr. Logar said: "All industries are now centering on government work. One hears nothing but war talk. Russia has 8,000,000 men in training or action and everywhere there seems to be serene confidence that nothing but victory is ahead."
