And a further sum of 741. 4s. and $4\frac{1}{2}d$. to Stephen Binney, Esquire, being Drawback of 1s. and 3d. Sterling on nine hundred and fifty gallons of Wine, agreeably to his Petition and

the Report of the Committee thereon.

And a further sum of 2891. 2s. and 3d. to John George Marshall, Esquire, to enable him to defray the expenses incurred by him for printing, paper, &c. in the publication of a Work called "The Justice of the Peace and County and Township Officer," and the sum of 501. additional to the said John George Marshall, Esquire, as a compensation for his own services in compiling and preparing the said Book for publication.
