Of the Reverend L. N. Francœur, Curé, and others, of the Township of Wolfestown; praying aid for the Wolfestown and Wotton Road.

Of T. Proux and others, of the Township of North Ham, County of Wolfe; praying aid for a bridge over the River Nicolet.

Of Joseph Richy and others, of the Township of North Ham, County of Wolfe; praying aid for a road in the Township of North Ham.

Of T. W. Guest and others, of the County of Perth,—of J. E. Davis and others, of Clinton,—of William Logan and others. of Mitchell,—and of Stephen Whitby and others, severally praying that duties be imposed upon Fruits, Vegetables, Plants and Trees, imported from the United States.

Of James Wilkinson and others, of the Township of Goderich,—of J. Higgins and others, of the Township of Stanley,—of S. McMath and others, of the Township of Goderich,—of the Municipality of the Township of McGillivray,—and of Peter Grant and others, of the Township of Stanley; severally praying that the amendments to the School Laws of Upper Canada, proposed by the Superintendent of Education for Upper Canada, may not become law.

Of Messrs Peter Grant and Company, of the City of Hamilton; praying for amendments to the fiscal regulations affecting the assessments and collection of the excise duty on Malt-liquors.

Of the Reverend George Beaubien, Curé, and others, of the Township of Callière; praying aid for a road in the said Township.

Of Ambroise Gauthier and others, of the Parish of Ste. Agnes,—and of J. Hamel, M.D., and others, of the Parish of St. Etienne de la Malbaic; severally praying for amendments to the Fishery Act.

Of James Lorenzo Gage, of the Township of Nelson, in the County of Halton, and Harriette Margaret Gage, his wife; praying for the passing of an Act to declare and settle the constitution of her marriage settlement, and to confirm assurances made thereunder.

Mr. Somerville, from the Standing Committee on Standing Orders, presented to the House, the eleventh Report of the said Committee, which was read, as followeth :---

Your Committee have examined the notices given on the following Petitions, and find them sufficient, viz.: of Margaret Besserer,—of Edouard Bourassa, and others, for erection of certain portions of the Townships of Inverness and Halifax North, into a separate Municipality,—of John McCallum and others, for an Act to confirm a certain survey of the 6th, 7th and 8th ranges of Grenville,—of J. B. E. Dorion, for incorporation of Victeriaville as a town,—and of William Lynn Smart.

On the Petition of J. B. E. Dorion, for an Act to divide the Municipality of Upton North East, by erecting the Parishes of St. Bonaventure and St. Guillaume into separate Municipalities, on which your Committee reported unfavorably in the last Report, they now find that the notice is sufficient.

The Petition of J. Brown and others, praying for the incorportion of a Company, by the name of the Long Point Company, with extensive powers, among which are the construction of a canal through the Long Point cut, with authority to levy tolls; this last mentioned privilege is not mentioned in the notice, which is in other respects sufficient. Your Committee therefore recommend that permission be given to introduce a Bill on the Petition, excluding however, this particular provision.

The Petition of Madame Yvonne Le Bihan and others, for incorporation of the Ursuline Academy of Chatham, is not of a nature to require the publication of notice.

Ordered, That the Select Committee on the Bill to amend and consolidate the several Acts respecting the Assessment of Property in Upper Canada, and other references, have leave to report from time to time.

Mr. Mackenzie, from the Select Committee on the Bill to amend and consolidate the several Acts respecting the Assessment of Property in Upper Cannda, and other references, presented to the House the First Report of the said Committee, which was read, as followeth :--

Your Committee have carefully considered the Bill respecting the Assessment of Pro-
