hands of the Receiver General unappropriated, there be granted to the said John White, for and during his natural life, the sum of Twenty Pounds annually, which said sum of Twenty Pounds shall commence and become payable from and after the passing of this Act.

1. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of Twenty Pounds, shall be paid by the Receiver General, out of the rates and duties aforesaid, in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as may from time to time be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, and be accounted for to His Majesty, through the Lords Commissioners of His Treasury for the time being.in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors may please to direct.

C H A P. XXVI.

An Act to make good certain Monies issued and advanced by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, in pursuance of an Address of the House of Assembly.

[Passed 17th January, 1822.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

HEREAS, in pursuance of an Address of your Commons House of Assembly during its last Session, to His Excellency Sir Peregrine Maitland, Lieutenant Governor, of your Province of Upper Canada, the sum of One Thousand and Fifty Pounds Seventeen Shillings and one penny, half penny has been issued and advanced by your Lieutenant Governor, to the Clerks and other Officers of the two Houses of Parliament, to enable them to pay the contingent expences of the last Session of the Provincial Legislature, may it therefore please your Majesty that it may be enacted, And be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of An Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province and by the authority of the same. That out of the fund or funds subject to the disposition of the Parliament of this Province and in the hands of the Receiver General, unappropriated, there shall be issued and applied the sum of One Thousand and Fifty Pounds dress to defray the con-N
