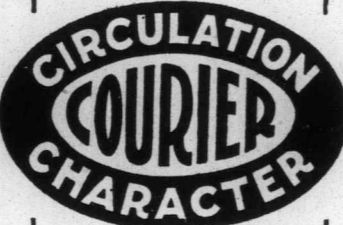

MAYOR ON GOVERNMENT ROAD ISSUE

Mayor Bowly has sent the following letter to the City Clerk of London:

Brantford, March 15, 1917.
S. Baker, Esq.,
City Clerk, London, Ont.

Dear Sir—
Col. Leonard, our City Clerk, has handed me your communication of the 17th March, 1917, at which I cannot but express surprise as you may or should have been acquainted with my communication to you of the 9th Feb., 1917, which reads as follows:

"Re amendment to the Provincial Road Roads Highways Act. On the 6th inst. your Clerk advised you a resolution passed by our City Council in reference to the subject matter. Of course it would seem to me expedient to have concerted action in the premises, and therefore I desire to know what, if any steps, your Mayor has taken to carry out the purposes sought by our and your communication. Has the matter been communicated with the Secretary of the Ontario Municipal Association? Has he arranged for a time and place of the presentation of the protest to the Ontario Government, and if so what time and place has been fixed? I would suggest that in the near future your Mayor, as the originator of this purpose, should come to some conclusion as to the means and methods by which we should accomplish our purpose and in that manner take such steps as will result in what we seek.
