



MACHINERY IS WORKING WELL

Military Service Act Comes Smoothly into Operation Throughout Country

Associated Press. Ottawa, Oct. 31.—Successful operation of the machinery placed throughout the country for the enforcement of the Military Service Act is reported from all points. The rush of the men in the first class to be medically examined and to be drafted with the authorities were established and has continued steadily ever since.

Since the proclamation was issued, on October 15th, the men have been going to the post-offices in large numbers to comply with its requirements.

As was expected, a large number of men are seeking exemption. A comprehensive system of handling these exemption claims has been established and it is expected confidently that no trouble will be found in dealing with each case satisfactorily. The officials charged with putting the act into operation in this connection, the new masters of the country are playing an important part—will be exceedingly busy until November 10, the last day for answering the call.

GREECE LOOKING BEYOND THE WAR

Has an Eye to Territorial Changes Which Must Come With Peace

TURK TO BE BANISHED

Greece Hopes to Succeed in Control of the Dardanelles

Athens, Oct. 31.—(Correspondence of The Associated Press)—The Turk is to leave Europe as the Entente allies have required in their war terms, then there is a well-defined belief in the Balkans that two results will occur of high importance to Greece and all Europe.

First.—That the Greek inevitably will succeed the Turk throughout Thrace and in the whole region down to the Dardanelles and the Bosphorus.

Second.—That a new zone of territory friendly to the Entente will thus be stretched horizontally straight across the Balkans as a barrier to the German dream of making the Balkans a German highroad to the Orient.

Professor Andreade of the University of Athens, one of the foremost authorities on international affairs relating to the Balkans holds this view and in the course of a talk to the Greeks he explained how these two results would naturally come about in the final peace adjustment, by reason of the principle of nationality which recognizes the racial condition of a community, will lead to the recognition of Greek paramount influence in that section. Thus, the principle of nationality has been ignored, and violated in all Balkan states, and force has prevailed. Austria and Bulgaria have not occupied any of the territory annexed in recent years by reason that their race or nationality prevailed in these sections, but solely by reason of their military force. That has been the cause of the endless wars in the Balkans, for people are never satisfied when their race is ignored and they are attached to a foreign conqueror by force."

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN HOUSE AND LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, who was at the commencement of the present war, and who is now a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duties—six months residence upon and cultivation of land in each of three years.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$100 per acre. Duties—six months in each of three years after making homestead patent and cultivating 20 acres arable land. May obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$200 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 20 acres and erect a house worth \$2000.

Holders of entries may count time of employment as farm labourers in Canada during 1917, as residence duties must be paid on certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and who have been honourably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for entry in local office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent.
