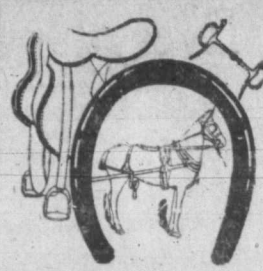


185TH PIPERS
