A Report that the Immediate Following of the Kaiser is Exerting Pressure on Him to Follow the Example of the Czar and Abdicate.

ROME, April 24—The Corriere d'Italia, the clerical organ, declares that it is able to confirm reports, published in the Spanish newspapers that the immediate following of the German emperor is exerting pressure on him to abdicate. The paper says that at a recent meeting of the Hohenzollern family one member bolder than the rest, intimated that the emperor might save the situation by following the example of Emperor Nicholas.

The German Monarch is reported to have turned pale and after observing that the general opinion was against him, left the room muttering: "We shall see." The same evening he summoned another family council. The chancellor and some of the ministers were present, but whatever passed remains unknown.

Little importance is attached to this story in Italian circles. In these quarters it is thought that the story has a German origin and is put out with the intention of influencing opinion.

ONE MEATLESS MEAL A DAY IN FRANCE

PARIS, April 23—One meatless meal each day has been officially decided upon instead of two meatless days per week as a measure of economy by the Minister of Supplies. All restaurants will be prohibited from serving anything in the nature of meat, poultry or game for the evening meal. All butcher shops will be obliged to close at one o'clock in the afternoon.

THE EARL OF SHANON KILLED IN ACTION

LONDON, April 4—Richard Bernard Boyle, seventh Earl of Shannon, has been killed in action. He was a lieutenant of the Royal Fusiliers.

**The Care of Cows**

Milk fever can generally be prevented by feeding sparingly for a few weeks before calving, and by giving the cow a pound of salt a week before she is due and another smaller dose at the time of calving.

Bad milking is a common cause of udder trouble. If cows not milked clean they are liable to go wrong in the udder, and particularly so when in their full flow of milk. Another source of bad udders is carelessness in drying off the cows.

Cows should always have access to salt; it essential for the maintenance of health.

Care should be exercised in turning out cows in the Spring. They should be housed for the first few nights and gradually accustomed to green food, otherwise cases of hoven or bloat may occur, and may prove fatal if not quickly taken in hand.
