CAVALRY CAN NOW SHOOT.

This Army of the German Army Given an Increased Efficiency.

With the opening of the new year of military training a new manual of regulations for rifle practice in the cavalry army went into effect in the German army. It is designed to improve greatly the standard of marksmanship and to render the cavalry independent of infantry support in making expeditions into the enemy's country where it is separated from the main body of its own army for days at a time, and wherein rapidity of movement is as essential as ability to resist attack.

In the Franco-German war of 1870 the German cavalry for the most part had no firearm except the cavalry pistol, which was no better than a pognon against the French chasseur. The operations of the cavalry were greatly restricted on this account.

Later the carbine was made the standard arm of the service, and the present effort to develop its effectiveness is a result of the part that cavalry played in the Manchurian campaigns of the Japanese-Russian struggle.

During the winter the recruits are drilled in hitting, and their sight is trained by obliging them to distinguish at average battle distances objects not easily separable from the natural background.

SPIRIT OF THE BOULEVARD.

The boulevard is a kingdom—an imperium in imperio—without any acknowledged king, but with a large number of pretenders to the throne. With the rise of the republic in France an aristocracy of intellect has taken the place of the old aristocracy of birth and actually governed the country in its stead.

The days of the dandies, of the titted noceurs led by Duc de Gramont Caderousse, the Marquis of Hertford, Lord "Arsouille," are over. Even the Maison Doree, on whose narrow staircase the Duke of Hamilton, after a copious dinner, fell and broke his neck, has been swept away.

Half a century ago the title of "king of the boulevard" would have been given to some great courtier and wealthy nobleman, a Morny or a Demidoff, whose equipage and outriders would have added a summer radiance to the Avenue de l'Impératrice (now the Avenue du Bois de Boulogne), who would have been the habitue of the "grand sixteen," that famous dining room at the Cafe Anglais where on occasion Cora Pearl, the most extravagant demimonde of her day, was served up in the costume of Eve on a silver platter.

The automobile, with its waterproofs and goggles, has supplanted the brilliant equipages a la Daumont and the sumptuous liveries of the imperial epoch. Seekers after more sensual pleasure and riotous dissipation no longer have their needs supplied by the boulevard; they must go farther afield—to Maxim's, the Rat Mort, the Nouvelle Athènes, the Tabarin, where the jeunesse dorée of the present generation repeat at less expense of either taste or money the wild junketings of their fathers and grandfathers.—Harper's Weekly.

Materializing the Flying Dutchman.

(Westminster Gazette.) A strange sea phantom, which very probably has helped to create the legend of the Flying Dutchman, is stated to have been run to earth by the Argentine Government. Many vessels have reported after rounding the Horn that they have sighted what seemed to be a derelict vessel, or one in need of assistance, sailing in through the straits with decks awash and masts broken. Some vessels have run aground, while trying to get near this mysterious apparition, under the belief that there must be a navigable passage for it to sail. None of a number of jagged rocks, which at five miles distance has the appearance of a dark running under short sails. Probably the white sails of the visionary vessel are produced by the sea birds whirled up in the wake of the vessel, which has often led the lonely islet of Rockall, which lies out in the Atlantic to the west of the Hebrides and was the grave of a Norwegian emigrant ship a year or two ago, to be taken for a vessel under full sail.

Lake Fleet in Harbor.

(Newmarket Evening Wisconsin.) More than \$5,000,000 worth of property is lying in the waters of Milwaukee harbor at the present time. This is the value placed on the winter fleet of boats here. Never before have so many and large freighters been laid up in this port for the cold season.

The total capacity of the grain and ore boats is placed at 2,000,000 gross tons of ore, 12,000,000 bushels of wheat. Three of the largest freighters, the Barling, Shagbush, and Oliver, are now in the winter fleet. All three are 10,000 ton boats, and were constructed at an expenditure of \$500,000 each. No other harbor on the Great Lakes has a fleet of such a mighty winter mooring as is situated in Milwaukee.
