The town of Newcastle, N. S., is talking of reducing the town council from eight to four members.

Premier Borden has declared that as soon as the Second Contingent has sailed some 17,000 troops will be recruited to take their places.

Dr. Robert J. Barrette, preacher, author and humorist, died at Pasadena, Cal., on Thursday last week.
