Canadian-West Land Regulations

The sole head of a family or any single over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war and who has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section pre-emption. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months in each of three years after earning homestead acre and cultivate 60 extra acres. May obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honorably discharged, receive one day priority in applying for land at local Agent's Office (that not Sub-Agent). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent.
