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

Two Masked Men

HOLD UP TOURING CAR.

Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Sept. 12 .-Three belated automobilists, hurrying into Poughkeepsie at a 40 miles ar hour pace in a big touring car, were halted at a lonely spot on the New State Road, near Rhinebeck, N.Y. early to-day by the swinging of a pai of red lanterns. As their machine stopped the lanterns went out, and two masked men hopped lightly to the high step of the car. There was one of them on each side of the autonobile and each carried a revolver.

"Get out here while we search you, said one of the men, as he swung open the door of the car. The automobilists stepped down, while the barrels of the two revolvers covered heir every movement. "Up with your hands and no fooling," was he next command. Then, while one of the highwaymen stood on the eat of the car, the other went through search of the pockets, missing nohing in his deliberate search. He ook out a bandana handkerchief, and earefully tied up in it his booty-\$175 n cash, three watches worth \$400 and some negotiable papers, the value of which is not stated.

The highwaymen stepped back to llow his victims to neturn to the car. when one of the trio, J. W. Townsley, f New York, stooped quickly, picked p a huge rock and sprang upon one f the men. The second highway nan, afraid to fire at Townsley for ear of injuring his companion, rushd to the rescue, shooting twice into he air as he came. He pulled Towns-'ey away, hurling him sprawling to vard the car, which the other tw utomobilists were entering.

The highwayman grabbed his com anion and disappeared in the darkness at the side of the road. The auomobilists, made record time to thinebeck, and from there telephone he authorities in Poughkeepsie and reighbouring towns. Deputy sheriffs vere at once sent out in pursuit of he highwaymen. Nearly a score of utomobile hold-ups have occurred his neighbourhood during the past 'ew weeks.
