London, July 12 .- A change has en made in the National Anthem. these days when the main thought roughout the civilized world is eace, one of the old verses of the anthem is said to have struck the King as sounding a somewhat disordant note. It runs:-

O Lord our God arise Scatter his enemies-And make them fail; Confound their politics, Frustrate their knavish tricks, On him our hope we fix O save us all.

That verse has now been replaced y the following, written by Dean fole and breathing a more peaceful

O Lord our God arise Scatter his enemies-Make wars to cease Keep us from plague and dearth Turn thou our woes to mirth over all the earth Let there be peace.

The alteration has been specially sanctioned by the King, and is therefore of national importance, seeing that it is now likely to be universally followed.
