

IN HARD AND FAST GAME.

Over 1500 spectators saw the Terra Novas go down to defeat before the Feildians by a score of 7 goals to 3 in the Prince's Rink last night. The game was a hard one, and fast throughout aithough the Feildians had by far the best of play. Some excellent attempts at combination were made and quite a number of goals were scored as a consequence. Individual play, however, predominated and some very spectacular work was put in by several members of both teams. As usual, Nix Hunt's goal-tending was the feature of the game. Every time he plays, the Feildian goalie seems more wonderful. His judgement is unerring, and almost uncanny at times, and he saved several shots which would have got past any other goalkeeper. Tait was also a tower of strength to the Feildians. He is, indeed, the backbone of his team, his defence work being yery fine and his individual play most spectacular. He also combines very well at times. Ewing again played a very good game. He seems to have the habit of finding himself near the end of the season. He worked hard last night and got in some very effective play, several of the Feildian goals going in off his stick. Winter also did well for his side. For the Terra Novas, Bob Stick played a star game. He played a strong defence game and made some good individual efforts also, most of which were, however, ineffectical. Canning played a very hard game but he showed a tendency towards selfishness which usually caused him to lose the puck before getting very far with it.
