The funeral and testamentary expenses and costs and all death duties would estate would be exhausted and the deceased's children would take no-

Secondly, under the law hitherto prevailing, where a man dies intestate without leaving father or issue, but leaving mother and brothers and sisters, the personal estate (subject to the interest therein of the deceased's widow, if any) has passed to the mother, brothers, and sisters in equal shares.

Under the new Act, however, the brothers and sisters in such a case are ignored, the mother taking the whole, and this right of the parent, whole, and this right of the parent, to the exclusion of the brothers and sisters, is extended also to the real estate or its proceeds.—Daily Mail.

Bigger Than a Liner

ALL METAL AIRSHIP TO LIFT

All airships yet devised will be

These American super-airships, however, will be larger than ocean liners, and will be borns aloft by 15,000,000 and even 20,000,000 cubic feet of gas. 
