Fyfe, Guelph Township, and 1 prime heifer from Mr. George Hall, 12 sheep, he exhibits some extra fine animals, and judging from their present condition we should readily say that they must be difficult to beat. In hogs, Mr. Tyson has on exhibition 2 really famous animals bred and fed by Mr. Wm. Hampson of Eden Mills, and weigh about 360 lb each; in addition he has what might be termed a royal porker of the Essex breed only 8 months old and weighing 300 lbs, a perfect little picture, and displaying in an admirable manner the wonderful qualities for early maturity characteristic of this breed. Mr. Tyson has also on hand a large number of first rate turkeys, geese, &c.

Leaving the Market House we find scattered round the Square Messrs. T. Simpson, and Albion and Lees, dealers in pork in its every variety of curing, and who have laid in a tempting Christmas supply in their line of business, the latter firm being particularly noted for the superior character of their cured bacon and hams.

In Upper Wyndham street, we have that popular favorite Mr. D. Naismith tempting his customers and the public generally with every conceivable rarity in the shape of pork, hams, sausages, spiced meats, turkeys, geese, fowls, in fact everything in his particular line of business that taste can dictate or money purchase.
