

Would the fact that one of the owners lives in the States complicate mattera to any considerable extent?

[Nore.—The process is set forth in section 546 of the Municipal Act, 1892. Notice of the intended bylaw for establishing or opening the street must be posted up for one month in six of the most public places in its neighborhood and published for four successive weeks in a newspaper. London and suburbs have a population of

London has two daily newspapers (morning and evening editions).
