# PORK REACHES A RECORD PRICE

## the London Market This Morning.

Seven dollars and fifteen cents a hundred pounds was paid for hogs on the London market this morning. This is the highest price ever paid for live porkers in this city, and it can be attributed to no other cause than the great scarcity of pigs throughout the entire western district,

Farmers who have hogs to sell are matters in connection with the Dominnot holding back for higher prices, but even then the supply is very limited, and altogether insufficient to meet the needs of the packing houses.

"There's money in raising hogs now," one farmer said on the market this morning. He had reason to say so. In December he bought a pair of six-weeks-old pigs on the market for \$7. Today he brought them to Dan McIntyre, buyer for the Canadian Packing Company, for \$34. They weighed slightly less than 250 pounds On the Contrary, Horse Was Shown

The farmer said that the feeding of the hogs had not cost him over \$4, wing him a net profit of \$23. Another farmer brought a load seven, which aggregated nearly 1,600 pounds. He also sold to Mr. McIntyre, and received a check for \$109 75. This was certainly a great day for the man who had hogs to sell.
