**THE BERLIN**  
**POLICYHOL**  
Union Life Patron Be Pro  
tected From Loss.

Agreement Is Reached by Which the  
Metropolitan Life of New York Will  
Assume All Policies and Assets and  
Even Those Who Dropped Out Will  
Be Reinstated on Payment of Back  
Premiums.

**TORONTO, June 30.**—Over 175,000  
Canadian policyholders in the Union  
Life Assurance Co. will be protected  
in full. After having for some time  
given up their prospects as hopeless,  
these investors—the majority of whom  
are not in a position to have suffered  
the loss without serious effect—will  
to-day learn the good news that their  
position is safe. Within the next few  
weeks each one of them will be per  
sonally visited by an accredited agent  
with a view to determining the dis  
posal of their assets and the continu  
ance of their policies.

By an agreement signed and sealed  
before Mr. George Kapelle, K.C., the  
official referee, on Saturday, all the  
policies and assets of the defunct  
company have been taken over and  
assumed by the Metropolitan Life As  
surance Co. of New York. Certain  
obstacles in the insurance laws of  
Canada and the United States, which  
threatened to endanger the reinsur  
ance negotiations, were overcome, and  
an arrangement was devised which  
proved entirely satisfactory to the  
official representatives of the Depart  
ments of Insurance in both countries.

The success of the negotiations will  
prevent disaster and loss of a large  
amount of money to thousands of  
policyholders, mostly industrial in  
vestors, who could ill-afford the  
threatened calamity, and places them  
in a position of security both for past  
payments and for the future. By the  
agreement all policyholders, both  
industrial and life, will be treated on  
the same basis as heretofore by the  
Metropolitan Life, and such lapses as  
have occurred owing to the condition  
of the Union Life Co. can be restored.  
Resultant on representations made  
by the English shareholders, the Min  
istry of Finance, at the beginning of  
the year, refused to renew the license  
of the Union Life, on the grounds  
that the liabilities of the company  
greatly in excess of its assets.  
Thousands of policies were allowed  
to lapse by their holders who feared  
the terms of the reinsurance  
now consummated, the

**OFFICES ARE RAIDED**  
Downing Street, London, Scene  
of Suffragette Riot.

Sylvia Pankhurst Leads M.b Against  
the British Cabinet Ministers In  
tending to Make Them Prisoners In  
Their Own Offices, But Police Suc  
ceeded In Quelling the Disturbance—  
Says Mother Is Dying.

**LONDON, June 30.**—Miss Sylvia  
Pankhurst, daughter of Mrs. Emmeline  
Pankhurst, the suffragette leader,  
led an attacking party to Downing  
street yesterday afternoon, for the pur  
pose of imprisoning the Cabinet Min  
isters. The expedition was unsuccessful,  
however, but the victory of the  
Miss Pankhurst without a series of  
monstrations in which both po  
sition of free speech injured.  
the Rt. Hon. Reginald D. a de  
Home Secretary for "killing" in  
cr." Then she invited the crowd  
to Downing street and "imprison" the  
Ministers in their own houses.  
Suing her action to her words,  
she jumped from the wagon, organized  
a large body of sympathizers, many  
of whom were dock workers, and  
marched at their head, down Whit  
hall, with the flag of the Women's  
Social and Political Union, surmount  
ed by a liberty cap.  
The police, however, had been ap  
prised of the intention of the demon  
strators and had thrown a strong cor  
don around Downing street. The dock  
ers tried to break through and some of  
the women went to their aid, but were  
severely handled. In the fighting wo  
men were thrown to the ground and  
the dockers were clubbed. Many of  
them were arrested. Meanwhile, some  
of the husky dockers, had thrashed a  
German here and there. Finally  
the police came to the rescue and  
dispersed the crowd.  
The incident which led to the march  
on Downing street was Miss Pan  
khurst's objection to a resolution put  
to the meeting, because it contained no  
reference to votes for women.

The suffragette leader left the active  
direction of affairs to her supporters.  
The police hastily gathered reinforce  
ments and cordoned both ends of  
Downing street.

Finding they were unable to enter  
Downing street from Whitehall, a  
large contingent proceeded through St.  
James' Park with the intention of  
forcing their way to the Ministerial  
residences through the park entrance  
to the street. This movement was suc  
cessfully resisted, however. The po  
lice seized the banner and cap of lib  
erty and other trophies. The distur  
bances lasted half an hour.

Finding themselves repulsed, Miss  
Pankhurst and her supporters march  
ed back to Trafalgar square.  
In the course of her speech she de  
clared that her mother was slowly  
dying—that her hair had gone nearly  
white in the past week.

**WESTERN CROPS BETTER.**  
Showers In the Prairie Provinces

**REGINA, Sask., June 28.**—The Sas  
katchewan Department of Agriculture

the influence of welcome showers all  
over the province. During the past  
few days many fears have been ex  
pressed that thunderstorms, combined  
with the cold which has prevailed in  
the nights and early mornings  
throughout the province, would have  
a bad effect upon the crop. Speaking  
generally, however, these fears have  
no foundation.

**Rain In Manitoba.**  
**WINNIPEG, June 28.**—There was a  
copious rainfall throughout Manitoba  
Thursday night, with great benefit  
to crops, which in most parts are badly  
in need of moisture. The outlook is  
greatly improved as a consequence.

Toronto Man To Organize For Cen  
tenary of Peace In Canada.

**OTTAWA, June 28.**—Mr. E. H.  
Scammell, F.R.C.I., F.C.I.S., of To  
ronto, has been appointed organizing  
secretary of the Canadian Peace Cen  
tenary Association, and has entered  
actively upon his duties. Active or  
ganizing work to forward the objects  
of the association will now be set on  
foot, and it is expected that at an  
early date Mr. Scammell will visit  
the Maritime Provinces and the east.  
Mr. Scammell is well qualified for  
the position, having had considerable  
experience as an organizer. An Eng  
lishman by birth, he is a Fellow of  
the Royal Colonial Institute and a  
Fellow of the Chartered Institute of  
Secretaries, and has had business ex  
perience in Great Britain, Australia  
and Canada.

**Veteran Practitioner Dead.**
