**INCREASE IS NEARLY A MILLION**

The Customs collections for October show another gain of nearly a million dollars as compared with the corresponding month of last year. The total customs receipts for the month just ended were \$5,296,747, an increase of \$500,245. For the seven months of the fiscal year the total customs revenue has been \$34,917,098, an increase of \$6,338,816 or nearly a million a month as compared with the corresponding period of last year. The rising tide of imports consequent upon the recovery from the trade depression of last year shows no signs of abating and indicates a prospect of an increase of about \$1,200,000 in customs revenue alone for the present fiscal year.
