## YOU CAN MOVEMENT AGAINST SAVE THE TEMERE DECREE MONEY

Toronto, Oct. 7.—With the church course of every Protestant body in Canada committed to a policy of opposition toward the Ne Temere decree, a new movement has been started by the evangelists of the Canadian Protestant alliance in Toronto. Every church of Canadian Protestants was represented. A public educational campaign by means of large mass meetings will be inaugurated. Finally a petition will be taken to the Government, and a demand made that the marriage laws of Canada will be placed beyond church interference. Petitions will also be laid before every provincial government in the dominion. As British Columbia and N. B. control their own marriage laws and retain the privilege of granting divorces, separate appeals will be made to them. The Government of Ontario will be asked to take steps at the earliest possible moment to have the court of appeals determine the extent and jurisdiction of the province and of the parliament of Canada on the subject of marriage laws.
