French Jealousy. PARIS, Dec. 9.—In a lecture on the Koch treat ment to-day Dr. Beaumetz stated that several patients who had been inoculated with the lymph had grown worse after the first injections and that in the cases of others no appreciable im-provement was shown. He had therefore de-cided to abandon the new method in his practice. Dr. Beaumetz also said he considered Prof. Koch had not made sufficient experiments upon ani-mais before applying the lymph to the cure of buman aliments, and declared his intention of buman aliments.

It shows that the remedy composed of the ptomaines of tubercullar cill, which is a poison as violent as the venom a serpent, cyanure of gold and glycerine.
