Occult and Potent Influences.

Not many days ago The Globe warned its readers against being misled by the publication of fac-simile reproductions of documents. The particular delusion that elicited the warning was the reproduction in The Empire of a fac-simile of a check exported from John Cuthbert, a licensed hotel-keeper, and its endorsement by leading lights of the party in this city.

"The publication of a fac-simile of a check," said The Globe, "is a favorite device of sensation-mongers to excite the public mind, and as a matter of fact, it is a device which has been used by them for many years to excite the public mind."
