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A CENTRAL PROVINCIAL BUREAU.

A Scheme to Render More Effective the County Constabulary of the Province.

An important meeting of the County of York Constables' Association was held last evening, President Wason in the chair.

It is generally known that the laxity in the administration of justice in rural districts is due to the fact that county constables who turn out to hunt down criminals are not only inadequately paid, but frequently have their labor for their pains.

It is now proposed to form a provincial bureau, with headquarters in Toronto, to which a chief will preside, with inspectors in each county. As soon as a crime is committed, the inspector will notify his chief, and prompt steps can then be taken to apprehend the perpetrator. It is proposed to have a fund set apart of several thousand dollars, raised by levying on the respective counties, from which the expenses of the constables will be met. This resolution was passed.

Moved by S. C. McElwain, and seconded by J. L. McElwain.

Whereas, it appears expedient that some better method should be adopted in this province for the protection of rural districts, there being at the present time no organization amongst the constables of the present system, and whereby in many instances criminals are allowed to escape and the safety of the community imperiled.

Resolved, That the County Constables' Association of York County, being a committee constituted by Wason, S. C. McElwain, William Boyd and D. T. Wilson, with power to add to their number, be authorized to consider what methods are advisable for the improvement of the present system, and to report as to the advisability of establishing a central provincial bureau for the purpose of inquiry, report and organization, so that outside constables may obtain information, etc., and thus render their duty as far as possible, the present constabulary.

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
