WOMEN JURORS WEEP, BUT FIND SLAYER GUILTY

Recommend Hanging As Fit Punishment For Bandit.

SEATTLE, Wn., Jan. 28.—It took a jury composed of five women and eight men just 54 minutes yesterday to convict John Schmidt, alleged bandit, of murder in the first degree, with a recommendation for hanging, at his trial on the charge of killing Police Detective James O'Brien in a pistol fight last Friday.

Two of the women jurors were weeping when the verdict was read.

FORD PLANT TO REOPEN

Resumes At Detroit On Monday With 25 Per Cent. of Force.

DETROIT, Mich., Jan. 28.—Partial resumption of operations by the Ford Motor Company on January 31 was announced today. At the Highland Park plant 25 per cent. of the force will return to work, while full operations will be resumed in the tractor plant at River Rouge. A number of foremen and others returned today to prepare for the resumption on Monday.

No announcement was made as to when the force at Highland Park plant would be further increased. The plant has been closed since December 24, upwards of 55,000 men being rendered idle.

NO CHANGE IN CANADA

WINDSOR, Jan. 28.—Interviewed today as to whether or not the Canadian Ford plant would reopen on January 31, in accordance with the rumored opening of the Detroit plant on that date, officials of the Canadian plant stated that there would be no change in the policy of the local factory for the next two weeks at least.

ACCUSED OF HIGH GRADING.

COBALT, Ont., Jan. 28.—Aron Peterson, a Swede, two months in Cobalt, is in jail here facing charges of high grading from the Nipissing mine. When arrested yesterday Peterson had one pound of ore in his pockets and 11 pounds were found at his lodgings.

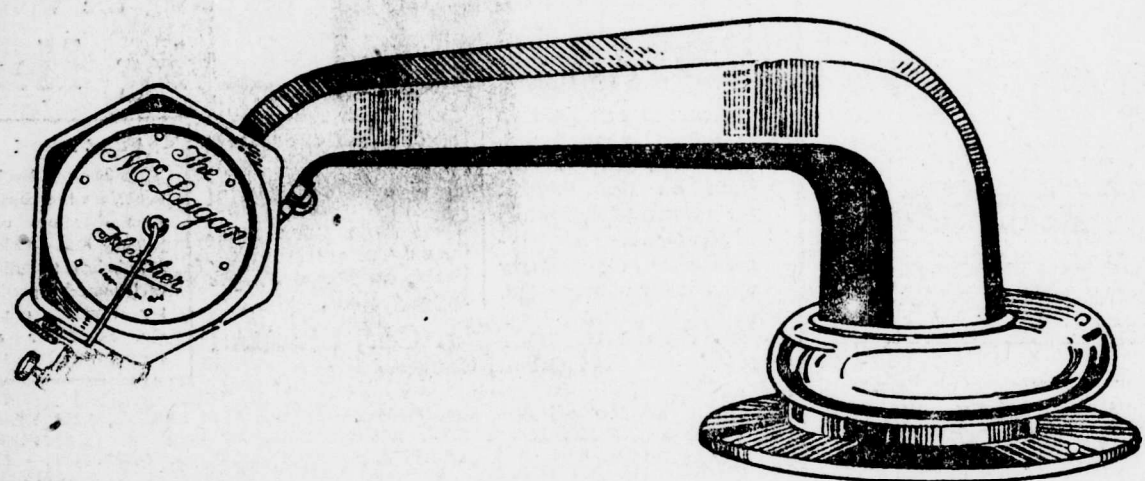

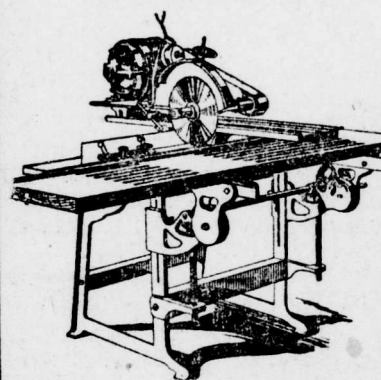

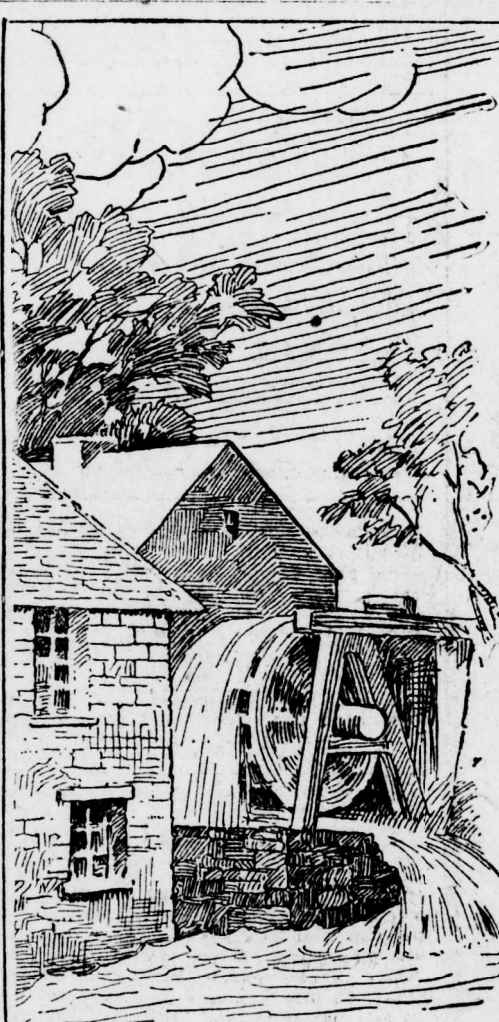

Pioneer Days in Flour Making
