Farm Drainage—Its Cost and Its Advantages

Thorough under-drainage may cost from \$20 to \$40 per acre, but it will pay for itself in from one three years because:

- 1—Land is ready for seeding earlier in the spring. 2—The soil is warmer in the early spring. 3—There is no drowning out of crops due to heavy and continued rains. 4—Fertilizers are not lost by surface washing. 5—More air circulates through drained than through undrained soils, and all crops require pure air for their best growth. 6—Roots of plants go deeper in drained than undrained lands. 7—Frosts do less injury to crops. 8—Drained land is more easily worked than undrained. 9—Machinery is thus materially reduced.
