Save Seed Corn and Serve Your Country

The need for saving seed corn for next year's use, was never greater than at the present time There is no reserve amount of seed in Ontario this Fall. All of the seed corn that was available was used last Spring, and upon this Fall's crop depends the crop of next year. Since the weather in Ontario in the forepart of the season was not favorable to the rapid growth of early corn, it makes the selection of seed this fall more difficult, and doubly urgent.

From now on, the farmers of Ontario will have one of the greatest opportunities of the year to serve their Country, and add to their own prosperity. By taking time enough to pick and to put away for next year's use, seed corn from the standing stocks in the field, every farmer can add five bushels to his average acre yield of corn. Not only this, but it is his duty in a year like this. to carefully save his own seed, and to save as much more as he can, all of it should be carefully dried as soon as selected.

This is Seed Corn time in Ontario. By selecting seed corn during seed corn time, one gets seed that will mature in normal years. Seed corn so selected has to be dried before the freezing weather, so that it will not be injured by freezing during the winter.
