GRADING CREAMERIES.

Dairy Branch Expects More Graded Butter In Ontario.

The number of creameries signifying their intention to take advantage of the butter grading service this year is considerably greater than during the past season. The members of the Toronto Produce Produce and the commission mee Exchange and the commission men in other parts of the province, as well as in Montreal, have agreed to pay an increased price for first-grade over second-grade butter and for pasteurized over the unpasteurized. The up-to-date creamerymen, especially those who are putting up even the whole or part of their goods in fifty-six pound packages, will naturally wish to give their patrons the advantage of this increase, and will, we believe, before the season advances very far, have their goods graded. The instruction service of the On-

tario Provincial Department of Agri-culture will be linked up closely with the butter grading department, the

inspectors being required to visit the inspectors being required to visit the butter grading station periodically, thus informing themselves as to defects in the butter from the creameries under their respective syndicates. Mr. C. Brodie has been engaged to inspect the cream-gathering stations, and a couple of men will be secured to check up the testing of cream and milk where the latter is purchased on a butter fat basis.

Altogether, the servivce of dairy instruction, so far as the creameries are concerned, has been thoroughly organized, and it now remains for the producers to furnish a high quality raw material, and for the manufacturers to reactive up the date methods. turers to practice up-to-date methods in the selection and handling of the cream, and for the commission men to pay for the finished product on the quality basis.

DROVE FRENCH FROM HAITI

Jean Jacques Dessalines, First Empere of the Island, a Slave Who. Became a Tyrant.

Jean Jacques Dessalines, known as Jean Jacques J. Emperor of Haiti, was a rough and illiterate negro of indefatigable energy who, in 1801 to 1803, defied the French general. Leclere, brother-in-law of Napoleon Bonaparte, and a French army of 25,000 troops, finally forcing the French to evacuate the island in November, 1803.

Dessalines was born in 1758 at Grand Riviere, Haiti, and sold as a slave at Cape Francais, now called Cape Haitien. In 1791, he became one of the trusty subordinates of Francois Dominique Toussaint, with the rank of

lieutenant-general.
In 1803 Dessalines was appointed governor for life, inaugurating his rule with a bloodthirsty massacre of all the whites left on the island after its evacuation. In the same year he pro-claimed himself emperor and was crowned with great pomp. His subjects soon grew tired of the tyranny and cruel despotism with which he ruled the island, and Dessalines was assassinated in 1806 by two of his officers, Henri Christophe and Alexandre Sabes Petion, the first establishing himself as president in the
