Had you done me, Sir, the honor of paffing with me but three days only, you would foon have feen what fort of a nation it is that I have to deal with. I am obliged to hold frequent and long parleys with them, and, at every occafion, to heap upon them the most fair and flattering promifes. I must inceffantly excite them to the practice of acts of religion, and labor to render them tractable, fociable, and loyal to the king (of France). But especially, I apply myself to make them live in good understanding with the French.

With all this, I affect a grave and ferious air, that awes and impofes upon them. I even take care of obferving measure and cadence in the delivery of my words, and to make choice of those expressions the properess to strike their attention, and to hinder what I say from falling to the ground. If I cannot boass that my harangues have all the fruit and success that I could wish, they are not however wholly without effect. As nothing inchants
