COMMERCIAL FORM.

Many boys and young men are anxious to obtain a thorough business education without being forced to study those subjects required only for entrance into the learned professions. To meet this want, there has been established in Pickering College a *Commercial Form*, in which no student is required to take other subjects than Commercial Arithmetic, Book-keeping, Penmanship, Business Composition and Commercial Geography. These subjects are taught so thoroughly that an industrious and attentive pupil, who has passed through the form, will be as competent to work in a counting-house or take charge of a set of books as it is possible to be without actual business experience. Commercial Certificates are awarded to students who pass the required examination.
