The College Course of the Faculty of Medicine of McGill University begins in 1901, on September 20th, and will continue until the beginning of June, 1905.
The Faculty provides a Reading Room for Students in connection with the Medical Library which contains over 25,000 volumes—the largest Medical Library in connection with any University in America.

MATRICULATION.—The matriculation examinations for entrance to Arts and Medicine are held in June and September of each year.

The entrance examinations of the various Canadian Medical Boards are accepted.

FEES.—The total fees, including laboratory fees examination and dissecting material, \$125 per session.

Courses.—The **REGULAR COURSE** for the Degree of M. D. C. M. is four sessions of about nine months each.

DOUBLE COURSES leading to the Degrees of B. A. or B. Sc., and M. D., of six years have been arranged.

ADVANCED COURSES are given to graduates and others desiring to pursue special or research work in the Laboratories of the University, and in the Clinical and Pathological Laboratories of the Royal Victoria and Montreal General Hospitals.

A POST-GRADUATE COURSE is given for Practitioners during May and June of each year. The course consists of daily lectures and clinics as well as demonstrations in the recent advances in Medicine and Surgery and laboratory courses in Clinical Bacteriology, Clinical Chemistry, Microscopy, etc.

DIPLOMAS OF PUBLIC HEALTH—A course open to graduates in Medicine and Public Health Officers of from six to twelve months' duration. The course is entirely practical, and includes in addition to Bacteriology and Sanitary Chemistry, a course on Practical Sanitation.

HOSPITALS.—The Royal Victoria, the Montreal General, and the Montreal Maternity Hospitals are utilized for the purposes of Clinical instruction. The physicians and surgeons connected with these are the clinical professors of the University.

These two general hospitals have a capacity of 250 beds each, and upwards of 30,000 patients received treatment in the department of the Montreal General Hospital alone last year.
