

**ARTICLE VI****COMPLIANCE WITH DOMESTIC LAWS AND POLICIES**


1. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require a Party to act in a manner inconsistent with its laws, regulations, or policies then in force.
2. This Agreement supersedes, as between the Parties, the Long Term Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics to Facilitate Economic, Industrial, Scientific, and Technical Cooperation done at Ottawa, on July 14, 1976, as well as the Protocol extending that Agreement done at Ottawa, on October 2, 1986.

**ARTICLE VII****ENTRY INTO FORCE, REVISION, TERM AND TERMINATION**


1. This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of an exchange of notes confirming that the Parties have completed their respective legal requirements necessary to bring it into force. In the event that the exchange of notes does not take place on the same day, the Agreement shall enter into force on the date of the last note.
2. Except as set out above, nothing in this Agreement terminates or amends the Agreements already in force between the Parties.
3. This Agreement shall remain in force until terminated by either party upon six months written notice to the other party.
4. At the request of either Party, this Agreement may be revised in full or in part by mutual agreement. The cooperation contemplated by this Agreement shall be in accordance with the laws, regulations and policies in force in Canada and in Ukraine.
5. The revision or termination of this Agreement shall not affect the validity of arrangements or contracts already concluded under this Agreement or any other trade and investment agreements or arrangements.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF** the undersigned, being duly authorized to that effect by their respective Governments, have signed this Agreement.
