Note that LES-00 to LES-03 represent approximately 1,412 employees occupying such positions as gardeners, cleaning staff, messengers, drivers, etc. who require less training. These categories represent 128 student days.

While 75% Non-Rotational employees participated in a learning activity, most of their training was on systems and software related to their positions and official language training.

Rotational employees account for 53% of all student days in 2005-2006. Of this, a third represents official language training and a quarter represents foreign languages training.
