Mr. R. N. Thompson (Red Deer): Mr. Speaker, I rise on a point of order. I think there ought to be a word said about this vote because it involves an issue that certainly is not clear, in the nature of the vote itself. It seems to me that this motion should have been transferred for debate because it involves an issue that reaches right into the heart of our national and economic autonomy, where Wall street financial interests moved directly through to the United States state department and, in so doing, were practising the kind of imperialism which seeks to bring pressure to bear on Canada—pressure which we do not need or want—

Mr. Speaker: Order please. I cannot agree with the hon. member for Red Deer (Mr. Thompson) that this is a point of order. It seems to me that in the remarks he is making he is reflecting on the vote of the house, which
