An Act to amend The Seeds Act, 1937.

An Act to amend the Dairy Industry Act. An Act to amend the Bank of Canada Act.

An Act to amend the Special War Revenue Act. An Act to amend the Income War Tax Act.

An Act to authorize the provision of moneys to meet certain expenditures made and indebtedness incurred by the Canadian National Railways System during the calendar year 1938, and to authorize the guarantee by His Majesty of certain securities to be issued by the Canadian National Railway Company.

An Act respecting the Franchise of Electors and the Election of Members

of the House of Commons.

An Act to establish a Board of Transport Commissioners for Canada, with authority in respect of transport by railways, ships and aircraft.

An Act respecting Radio in Canada.

An Act to assist in the Construction of Houses.

An Act to amend The Farmers' Creditors Arrangement Act, 1934.

An Act to amend the Criminal Code.

To these Bills the Royal Assent was pronounced by the Clerk of the Senate in the following words:—

"In His Majesty's name, the Honourable the Deputy Governor General

doth assent to these Bills."

Then the Honourable the Speaker of the House of Commons addressed the Honourable the Deputy Governor General as follows:—

" MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOUR:

"The Commons of Canada have voted Supplies required to enable the Government to defray certain expenses of the Public Service.

"In the name of the Commons, I present to Your Honour the following Bill:—

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain sums of money for the public service of the financial year ending 31st March, 1939.

"To which Bill I humbly request Your Honour's Assent."

To this Bill the Clerk of the Senate, by command of the Deputy of His Excellency the Governor General, did thereupon say:—

"In His Majesty's name the Honourable the Deputy Governor General thanks His Loyal Subjects, accepts their benevolence, and assents to this Bill."

After which His Honour the Deputy Governor General was pleased to close the Third Session of the Eighteenth Parliament of the Dominion of Canada, with the following Speech:—

Honourable Members of the Senate:

Members of the House of Commons:

In bringing the present session to a close, I desire to express my appreciation of the careful attention given the many measures submitted for your consideration.

International relations and domestic conditions continue to be affected by conflict, disorders and tensions in different parts of the world. The disturbed situation abroad, and prolonged and unprecedented drought in Western Canada, have, unfortunately, somewhat retarded recovery. Improvement in economic conditions has, however, been more steadily maintained in Canada than in many other countries. Gratifying factors in the situation are the further diminution in the numbers on relief, and the progressive and substantial reductions in the
