The course itself will be a judicious blend of the traina(ing in Electricle Engineering and in the Honour course of Mathematics and Physics.

Such a training is no new thing; for several distinguished men have already received it at McGill, such as Dr. L.V. King, Dr. R.W. Boyle of thenUniversity of Alberta, orucleur who did such distinguished war work in Applied Physics, and Mr. E.S. Bieler who has just gène to Cambridge with an 1851 Exhibition.

The new course has not yet received sanction from the Corporation of the University, but there is no reason why suitable men should not begin their work at once at the opening of the session, as they will be following approved courses.

It is hoped that a B.Sc. may be granted at the end of the fourth year and an M.Sc. at the end of the fifth year, if a suitable thesis is presented.
