I am glad to be able to report that our new church, to which I have had occasion to refer from time to time, was completed externally in October. It is generally acknowledged to be a very handsome building, and in the excellence and high finish of the work, to reflect much credit upon those engaged in its erection.

A vestry meeting was held in October for the purpose of making arrangements with the contractor, to whom a debt of \$800 remained due; but the fall lishery had proved a failure, and the outcry of poverty was so loud that it was felt to be useless and inexpedient at the time to attempt to collect even a small portion of this amount from the mem-
