Stockers and Feeders. Prices for feeders and stockers were firm for the best grades; choice steers, 1000 to 1150 lbs., \$6.00 to \$6.50.

Choice veal calves are scarce, and prices were very firm; choice veal calves sold at \$9.50 to \$10.50; good calves, \$8.50 to \$9.25.

The market for sheep and lambs was firmer. Sheep, light ewes, 100 to 120 lbs., \$4.50 to \$5.00; ewes, 140 to 160 lbs., \$5.00 to \$5.50.

Hog prices were unchanged. Select, fed and watered, \$8.45, and \$8.50 f.o.b. cars to drovers, and \$9.10, weighed off cars.
