SYNOPSIS OF DOMINION LAND ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any mate over 1s years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, saskatchewan or Alberta, The apputant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District, Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending nonesteader.

Duties: Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
