WHEAT MARKET IS STILL WEAK

Prospect of Favorable Official Report on Crops Powerful Influence.

CHICAGO, April 6 .- Chances that the ernment crop report tomorrow will market closed easy at %c to %c net decline. Corn finished with a gain of 1/2c to 1/2c, oats up 1/4c to 1/2c, and provisions varying from a shade off to 5c advance.

Belief in a bearish official report on the growing crop in this country altho

the growing crop in this country altho of prime importance, was by no means the only influence causing the wheat market to sag. Contrary to what was expected, northwestern receipts were liberal and world's shipments enlarged. Besides about 2,000,000 acres in western Kansas, which had been rather dry, reported general rains, and Liverpool sent word of cheaper offerlings in Russia. Cash demand, too, was slow and export bids out of line, both at the seaboard and by way of the gulf.

Corn Was Strong.

Despite free offerings from Argentine all along the coast from the St. Lawrence to Texas, the corn market here turned strong. Shortage of corn for quick domestio use by interior states was said to be growing more urgent. The Missouri April report disclosed only one-third of a supply, compared with a year ago.

Weather that meant delay for seeding brought independent firmness to oats.

Provisions rallied on account of a fair demand from the south. At the outset, however, the market seemed to be headed down grade in sympathy with a break in the price of hogs.
