FOUND BODY OF
HAMILTON MAN

W. C. Macklem, Who Escap-
ed From Guelph Sanitarium,
Ended Life at Lewiston.

NIAGARA FALLS, N. Y., April 19.—
The body of W. C. Macklem, 21 years old,
461 Dundas street, Hamilton, who
disappeared from the sanitarium at
Guelph, April 18, was found in the
woods on James' Hewitt's farm on
Lewiston Mountain, this afternoon.
Coroner Walter A. Scott said the man
had evidently been dead two or three
days. He said death was due to cyanide
poisoning. A note was found on the
body. It was evidently written by
the young man when his mind was
unbalanced. There will be no inquest,
the case being clearly one of suicide.

Last Monday his mother, Mrs. Mac-
klem, Hamilton, received a post-
card postmarked this city, bearing
the message: "Good bye, mother; I
am tired of living; shall go over the
falls." The police could find no trace
of the man here.

Shortly before noon today Ernest
Brown and Nelson W. Tryon, Lewis-
ton, were walking through the Hewitt
woods when they came upon the body.
It was lying on the ground at the foot
of an evergreen tree. In the pocket
of the man's coat was found a ram-
bling letter. It told of the writer being
tired of life and how he had wearied
of friends trying to keep him alive.

"I found, address Mrs. Thomas Mac-
klem, 461 Dundas street, Hamilton," the
letter concluded. It was signed "W. C.
Macklem."

FLOUR MILLS FOR MEDICINE
HAT.

MEDICINE HAT, Alta., April 18.—
City officials advise the construction
of two large flour mills will be pro-
ceeded with this summer. These mill-
ing companies had arranged for the
sites in Medicine Hat last year, and
will now proceed with active construc-
tion. It is believed the expenditure
will approach two million dollars. The
companies will employ five hundred
men in construction work and a per-
manent staff after they are ready for
operation. It is expected the mills
will be ready for handling the crop of
1915.
