Franklin, Esquire, stiling himself Agent for the said House of Representatives 4 (and from whom the faid petition had been transmitted to the Right Honourable the Earl of Dartmouth one of your Mae jesty's principal Secretaries of State) and likewise by Israel Mauduit Esquire, from whom application had been made. to this Committee, humbly praying on behalf of your Majesty's said Governor and Lieutenant Governor, that he might be heard by Council in relation to the Address of the House of Representatives of the said province; and the said Beniamin Franklin, Esq. having thereupon prayed, that he might in that case be heard also by his Council at a future day-The Lords of the Committee did, in compliance with the petition of the faid Ifrael Mauduit, Efg. and at the s instance of the said Benjamin Franklin, * Esq. think proper to appoint a future day to refume the confideration of the ' faid petition of the House of Representatives of Massachusett's Bay, and to allow · Council to be heard on both fides thereupon.—And their Lordships having been f this day attended by Council on both fides accordingly, and heard all that they 6 had
