### MUNICIPAL TELEPHONES

Well Attended Meeting in Nassagaweya Township Hall.

At township hall of Nassagaweya, on Thursday night, a well-attended meeting of the ratepayers was held for the consideration of the proposal to establish a municipal telephone service under the provincial act. Addresses in explanation of the legislation were given by Samuel Charters, M.L.A., and F. Decker, and the benefits of the system were pointed out. It is believed that the plan will be adopted in the township at an early date. The feature which appealed to those present was that by the payment of \$10 or \$12 for ten years, the subscribers at the end of that period owned the whole system, while under the monopoly system, they are no better off than when they started.

### Sworn in as Judge.

BROCKVILLE, May 12.—(Special.)—Lt. Col. Fisher returned to Brockville from Pembroke, where he was sworn in as junior judge of the county of Renfrew by Judge Donohue. He will enter upon his official duties shortly.

## CARROLL SENTENCED TO DEATH—HANGS JULY 26

Stoically Received Fatal Words—Clemency May Be Extended to Him

SAULT STE. MARIE, Ont., May 12.—(Special.)—The assizes closed today, at the last duty devolving upon Justice Britton being the sentencing of Wm. Carroll to hang on July 26 for the murder of Jos. Taddon, in a lumber camp back of Blind River in November. Carroll received sentence in the same stoic manner, which has characterized his attitude throughout the trial. He had nothing to say, and in fact did not seem to realize his position. It is believed that clemency will be shown in Carroll's case, as he is an old man and had been confined in an asylum at London in 1902, from which he made his escape.

Frank Bishop and Chas. Burgess, charged with rape upon the person of Mary Arnesen, at Michipicoten, were discharged.

The grand jury in submitting its report touched upon the necessity for a new jail and court house, and is of the opinion that the present building is not adequate for the importance of the district.

## ALBERTA HARVEST PROSPECTS VERY BRIGHT

Crop Reports So Encouraging That All Calgary Activities Reflect the Outlook—Great Year For City.

CALGARY, May 12.—(Special.)—The reports received by the C.P.R. telegraph office to-night from the company's agents throughout the province are exceedingly favorable and indicate that the outlook is very promising.

The splendid rains appear to have been very general and extended over almost the entire country carried in the reports. Although the reports state that no anxiety was felt by the farmers on account of any lack of moisture, still the rain will without doubt do an immense amount of good and be the means of giving the seed a good start.

If the outlook was highly favorable a week ago it is doubly so now with the additional amount of seeding done, the added moisture and the splendid warm growing weather that has followed the rain.

These gratifying crop reports are reflected in all the activities of the city, to which a good provincial harvest means much, seeing that Calgary is the centre of the inestimably rich district in which the agriculture of Alberta shines.

But apart altogether from the encouraging crop outlook, the wonderful developments in the city and the city's progress with unabated force.

The trade returns show a constant increase in volume of all business; building operations proceed with tremendous activity. ### STEAMERS IN COLLISION.

NEW YORK, May 12.—The steamship Merida of the Ward Line, with 207 passengers from Havana for this city, was rammed by the steamer Admiral Farragut off Cape Charles, Virginia, shortly after midnight this morning. The Merida's passengers and crew were transferred to the Admiral Farragut. Water poured thru the gaping wound in the Merida's side, and five hours after the collision the steamship settled beneath the waves. The Admiral Farragut was somewhat damaged in the collision, but was able to proceed.

### SUMMONSES FOR BAKERS.

Summonses have been issued against the George Coleman Baking Company, 12 Euclid-ave., and W. H. Carruthers, manager of the Ideal Baking Company, 183 Dovercourt-road, charging them with the sale of lightweight bread. In the first case, it is alleged that 18 loaves were found 10 of which were 28 ounces shy, and at the other, 13 light loaves were seized, 10 of which were 24 ounces underweight. The cases come up Monday.

BROCKVILLE, May 12.—(Special.)—Mrs. James Stewart of Putnam's Corners died at her home as the result of a fracture of the skull while house-cleaning. She slipped from a ladder and fell, striking her head on some crockery. The woman never regained consciousness. She was 60 years old.

### Finished New Bridge.

PORT HOPE, May 12.—(Special.)—This morning the last section of the big C. N. R. bridge was placed in position, and as soon as the ties and rails are laid, trains will be able to cross.
